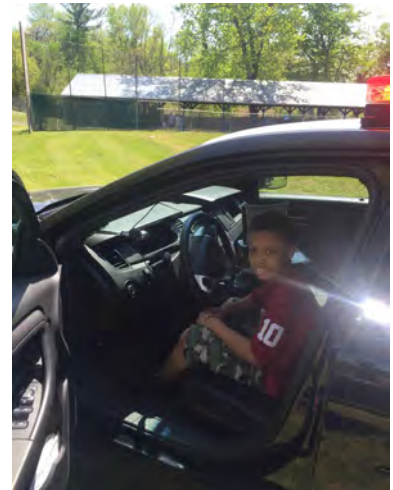
Sheriff Funds BKW Backpack Lunch Program
