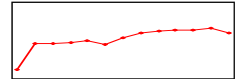
ABOUT OUR DEPARTMENT

The Department of Civil Service is mandated by New York State Civil Service Law to manage the employment and appointment of candidates in Classified Service, including those employees serving in the towns, villages, school districts, public libraries, special districts and special authorities within Albany County. The Department continuously provides technical oversight and management of Albany County government and its civil divisions to ensure compliance with New York State Civil Service Law, mandating that all appointments and promotions be made according to merit and fitness and the Rules for the Classified Services of Albany County.

DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- The Executive budget recommends that all Albany County employees be entitled to two exam fee waivers per year. Of those who took advantage of the current waiver policy in 2009, 10 out of 215 took more than two exams.
