The mission of the District Attorney's Office is to prosecute all crimes committed within Albany County to help ensure public safety.

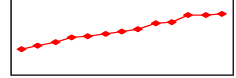
ABOUT OUR DEPARTMENT

The District Attorney is responsible for prosecuting criminal cases on behalf of the people of the State of New York. Duties include presenting cases to the grand jury for indictment, conducting hearings, trials, negotiating pleas and representing the people of the State at all phases of a criminal action, including appeals. The Office is divided into various bureaus consisting of the Street Crimes Bureau, the Special Victims Bureau, the Public Integrity Unit, the Major Offenses Bureau and the Justice Court Unit.

DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- The 2011 Executive Budget proposes a 7.7 percent or \$450,362 decrease in County Share for the District Attorney's Office.
- Three vacant lines are eliminated in this budget: the Director of Communications, an Assistant District Attorney, and one Legal Assistant.
- Ten positions were also eliminated through the offering of the Early Retirement Incentive.
